Questions and Info for leaders coming from other Churches into Lighthouse

1. Questions for other leaders coming to Lighthouse: - We value you, and we are keen to see God's kingdom grow in our Church and all around the world. We are not trying to stifle ministry, but simply want to be faithful and responsible with what God has given us, and to make sure we are all open and on the same page about where we stand and our expectations.

For this reason we would love to know your answers to the questions below. Further context behind the questions is given in the remainder of the document:

- MEMBERSHIP Do you want to be a member here (see point 7 below for more context on membership)? If not, how do you see your relationship with the Lighthouse elders? To what extent will you support, follow, and uphold their decisions, direction and discipline? How much do you want them to watch over and speak into your / your family's life?
- SERVICE Do you want to primarily invest your time, energy, resources and passion into this Church, or are you primarily building another ministry while attending here? If here, where are you willing and keen to serve? If elsewhere, what is/are the other ministries? Do you want any input, opinions or advice from us about your other ministry/ies? What do you hope to gain from attending Lighthouse?
- THE FUTURE Are any of the above answers likely to change in the near future? Is it
 possible or likely that you will want to start or lead another ministry in Jersey in the next few
 years?
- QUESTIONS or NEEDS Do you have any questions, comments or other needs you may need help with from us?
- 2. Our Values and Characteristics: We are a unique local Church. Our history, and the ways God has moved in our Church since its inception, are a marvellous story of God's supernatural provision and power. You are coming into something that is God-established and which we are so grateful for.

Our beliefs are strongly Biblical, Charismatic, and focused on the Great Commission.

Our style is unique to this local body and this local society. We come from many countries and cultures, and we seek to become culturally relevant to this Jersey culture so that we may "by all means save some" (1 Cor 9:22) This does not mean that we are dishonest, or that we compromise truth in any way. We seek to bring a <u>Biblical</u> culture to this culture, while staying relevant, so that we reach Jersey, rather than copying or bringing our own national cultures here.

God has given us a mission - to reach Jersey and the ends of the Earth for Christ by planting Churches and small groups.

We also have some specific beliefs about the local Church in general that you need to be aware of as you come into this Church family:

3. The Local Church :- The local Church is God's method and means for evangelising and discipling people and to fulfil the Great Commission.

"Parachurch" ministries (ministries that are not a "Church") may be helpful, but as they are only needed when the local Church is not doing its God given job, we generally do not support them, but rather seek to do the ministry they would do as part of this Church.

We believe that each Christian must commit and contribute to one local Church family and submit to the local elders there.

4. Elders: God has instituted leaders (called "shepherds" / "elders") to watch over and grow the local body of believers. They are the highest level of human authority in God's structure of leadership on earth.

These shepherds lead, teach, and equip the saints for ministry. They will give an account to God for how they led, and watched over the people He has put under their care. Jesus is the ultimate Good Shepherd (Jn 10), but He has also appointed "under-shepherds" (elders) to lead for Him and with Him. (1 Pe 5:1-4). In Jn 10:1-10 Jesus describes Himself as the Shepherd for the sheep, and the

"door" by which sheep, and other shepherds, enter the sheepfold. He says that "he who does not enter the sheepfold by the door, but climbs up some other way, the same is a thief and a robber." We, as the elders of this local Church, have a God given responsibility to be the "door" for this body, under Christ's guidance. This means that, apart from leading and caring for people, we are also responsible to decide who leads and ministers in this local Church. We take these responsibilities seriously, and we seek to honour and obey God in these matters.

5. The five-fold gifts: The 5-fold gifts listed in Ephesians 4:11 (apostle, prophet, evangelist, pastor, teacher) are not positions or titles in the Church, but rather descriptions of giftings given to people in the Church. The elders should exhibit some or all of these 5-fold giftings, but there may also be others in the Church with these giftings who are not elders.

The role of those with 5-fold giftings is not to <u>do</u> ministry, but rather to "equip the saints to do the work of the ministry" (Eph 4:12)

All of these 5-fold gifted people must submit their ministries to the elders in the local Church, and must be invited by them to do any local ministry.

6. Deacons / leaders :- The elders appoint some who will help them to lead and to disciple people, delegating this authority and ministry to "deacons". Those who are given this ministry must first be tested before they are given this role (1 Tim 3:10).

This testing includes:

- Time there must be a significant time period so that the elders can watch and get to know people well;
- Attitude the elders will look for humility, grace, willingness, helpfulness and submission;
- Relationships the elders need to genuinely get to know people, their families, and their personal lives;
- Character honesty, openness and integrity are what are being looked for;
- Service a willingness to serve and volunteer in any way needed.

While in the Bible these people are called "deacons", we call them "lifegroup leaders" and "worship leaders". While all members of the Church are called to be involved in ministry, and to exercise their gifts, not all are called to lead or to be given positions of authority. Leadership positions and opportunities are a privilege, not a right...they are not guaranteed.

Those who are not submitted and committed to this Church, and these elders, cannot be appointed to leadership positions in this Church.

- 7. **Members**:- For these reasons it is important that the shepherds know who is in their "flock". We call this "membership", and it is determined as follows:

 - The elders review this from time to time, and if they have any questions, or if circumstances change, they arrange a conversation with the person to come to mutual agreement.
